Barbara Blanchard – Executive Director

Barbara was one of the founding members of MEGA representing Tompkins County. Her current position as Executive Director of the Alliance is the culmination of a career as a professional planner focused on inter-municipal cooperation and partnership associations that bring together government and the private sector. She served on the City of Ithaca Common Council for 4 years and on the Tompkins County Legislature for 12 years.
